### More-Tishans Coming to the Fair

#### **1960s popular band coming to Historical Society booth to sign copies of “Garage Sounds” with author Scott Schell**

Washington County, Minn. – The remaining members of the hugely popular local band, the “More-Tishans” will be at the Washington County Fair on Saturday August 7<sup>th</sup> from 1pm to 4pm at the Washington County Historical Society booth in building C.

The members of the band, Chris Nelson and Hugh Kraemer, will be seated along side Scott Schell who wrote the book, “Garage Sounds: Bringing Down the House,” which captures the history of the Garage Band era of the 1960s and 1970s. The “More-Tishans” were inducted into the Mid-America Music Hall of Fame in May 2008. The band was well known throughout the area for their music and for driving to gigs in their hearse.

Also at the Washington County Historical Society booth will be Robert Goodman, author of the recently published *A History of Washington County: Gateway to Minnesota History* and *The Last Rafter*. Goodman will be at the booth on Saturday and Sunday from 10am to 1pm. Goodman, along with his wife Nancy, has previously written books on *Joseph R. Brown* and *Paddlewheels of the Upper Mississippi*.

Brent Peterson, Executive Director of the Washington County Historical Society, will be at the booth on Saturday from 4pm to 7pm and will be autographing his book, *Stillwater: The Next Generation*.

Stop out at the booth in Building C and look over all the fabulous publications of local and county history and talk with members of the WCHS Board of Directors about the exciting plans for the future.
