Atkinson Cemetery	<p>The Atkinson Cemetery occupies a trapezoidal piece of ground roughly 83 x 47 yards on the east side of US Highway 61 and between it and the parallel service road. It is 0.3 miles south of the intersection of Highway 61 and 14th Avenue (County Highway 22), just outside of the city limits of St. Paul Park. This cemetery is shown on the U.S. Geological Survey Topographic Map 7.5 Minute Series, for the St. Paul Park Quadrangle (1950). It is not shown on the General Highway Map for Washington County (1969). This cemetery was named for the New England homesteaders that settled the land. The last burial in this cemetery appears to have been in 1907. Some graves are marked with wooden crosses, on a few of which the painted inscriptions can still be read; on most of these the pain has long since disappeared. Other graves have concrete markers, in some of which the inscriptions were made while the concrete was still wet. One grave is marked by an uninscribed field stone.
